MATERIALS:

- 1/2 yard Flowers Cream
- 1/3 yard Blender Oyster
- 1/3 yard Blender Pink
- 1/3 yard Blender Green
- 3/8 yard Blender Dark Green for binding
- 1 yard Blender Green for backing

READ THROUGH ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE STARTING THIS PROJECT. FABRICS ARE SEWN RIGHT-SIDES TOGETHER USING A 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE THROUGHOUT. WOF = WIDTH OF FABRIC; RST = RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

From Flowers Cream Fabric:

- Cut [3] — 4-1/2" × WOF strips
- Subcut [6] — 4-1/2" × 15" rectangles **(A)**

From Blender Oyster Fabric:

- Cut [6] — 1-1/2" × WOF strips
- Subcut [12] — 1-1/2" × 15" rectangles **(B)**

From Blender Pink Fabric:

- Cut [4] — 2-1/2" × WOF strips
- Subcut [7] — 2-1/2" × 15" rectangles **(C)**

From Blender Green Fabric:

- Cut [6] — 1-1/2" × WOF strips
- Subcut [12] — 1-1/2" × 15" rectangles **(D)**

From Blender Dark Green Fabric:

- Cut [5] — 2-1/2" × WOF strips for binding

From Blender Green Fabric:

- Cut [2] — 18" × WOF strips for backing

ASSEMBLY:

Reference the Runner layout to determine the placement for each strip.

1. Match up the ends of the strips, secure with a couple of pins. Pin evenly across the strip.
2. Sew seam.
3. Press toward either fabric. Just keep it consistent.
4. Repeat steps to add the next strip, until you sewn all the strips of the Runner following this order:

CBDADBCBDADBCBDADBCBDADBCBDADBCBDADBC



BINDING:

1. Use your favorite binding method to prepare your binding strips.

BACKING:

1. Sew 18" × WOF Blender Green Backing Pieces together along the 18" side using a 1/2" seam allowance.
2. Press seam to one side.

FINISHING:

1. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing.
2. Quilt as desired.
3. Bind, & Label
4. Enjoy!
